I am not a lawyer and have no acumen to understand the intricacies of a document hundreds of pages long on the subject of Anti Terror Laws. Hence this plea in a non legal jargon.

As a person who is well aware of the goings-on in this respect and matters that affect a person's life in general, I am almost frightened of the proposed laws as they are being debated and analysed in public. The salient question that emerges is 'where is the evidence' for the requirement for such laws that will usurp my and my community's civil rights in an ostensibly civilised country like Australia.

'Frightened' of being shot in the back because of the hearing impairment the age of three scores and ten has inevitably visited on me and my wedded partner and friends. A shout of "You there, stop" at a crowded Railway Station would have no effect on us and we would just keep on walking, hearing aid or no hearing aid!

It was difficult to understand the internment of Germans, Italians and Japanese citizens during the wars, with in their own country Australia but this 'war on terrorism' I feel is covertly and even overtly generating an ethnic group of 'aliens', that is us Muslims, among Australians. It may be an impression only, never the less it is there and frightening. The media and talk-backs enhance this fear!

The general lack of knowledge in the Australian community, whence Islam the Faith and Muslims the people are juxtapositioned, is staggring. Has any body ever questioned Hitler's actions in WWII as that of a Christian's actions? Wasn't he taken just as a deranged person? Would not such laws therefore in fact become the reason for discord and hence give rise to terrorism where there is not?

Thanks to the immigration selection process, in the main the Muslim migrants to Australia, not withstanding the "religious brigade", are reasonably educated and understand the difference between their duties and rights of a citizen and rights of the community at large and I am sure that we have to date proved our bona fides to the country we have adopted as ours by choice. We are all immigrants, including the "original citizens". Is it the time scale that makes on a good or bad citizen?

Many of us even have our grand children born in this country and they sing the Australian National Anthem as proudly and as loudly as any body else.

In enacting these draconian laws please ensure that our `babies' are not thrown with the proverbial bath water.
