Marriage Equality Amendment Bill 2009

A marriage certificate allows same-sex partners to prove their relationship status if challenged. Same-sex partners are not equal under the law, or in the eyes of society, if they cannot marry. The Marriage Act continues to enshrine and foster discrimination against same-sex partners as long as it prohibits same-sex marriage. Opposite-sex partners have a choice of marrying or remaining defacto partners, a choice not open to same-sex partners.

Married partners have immediate access to all relationship rights, entitlements, protections and responsibilities. This contrasts with defacto couples who must cohabit for a certain period before they have rights and protections.

Denying same-sex partners the right to marry sends out the message that these partners are not capable of the love and commitment that is often associated with marriage.
