Re: Inquiry into the investment of Commonwealth and State funds in public passenger transport infrastructure and services

I am committed to using public transport whenever it is possible and practical. I currently live in Newcastle and regularly travel to Sydney by train. I travel locally by train, bus and bicycle as much as possible.

I own a car. I am a small business owner and need the car for travel to clients' properties – approximately eighty to one hundred per year.

I offer the following comments to the enquiry. Some may not seem directly relevant to the Enquiry but affect the extent of use of public transport.

- 1. The goals to minimise fuel consumption and minimise the generation of harmful emissions are fundamental.
- 2. People should be encouraged to use public transport instead of private transport whenever possible and practical.
- 3. Companion animals should be permitted to travel on public transport. We have a small dog, which is registered and well-behaved. Currently, when my partner and I travel to Sydney for more than a day and take our dog, we are forced to travel by private vehicle because the dog is not permitted on the train.
- 4. Travel by public transport should be free. The elimination of the cost of fare administration would be a considerable saving. This would encourage people to use public transport leading to a greater provision of services. It could be funded by the savings in provision of road infrastructure achieved by the reduction in private vehicle travel, and from fuel excise.
- 5. Public transport usage can encourage community development through regular social interaction.

- 6. Car share schemes and car rental should be encouraged with financial incentives for people who don't own vehicles.
- 7. The annual running costs of private vehicles such as registration and insurance, which are not relative to annual mileage, should be reduced to an absolute minimum and replaced with a levy included with the cost of fuel at the bowser. This encourages people to reduce their amount of travel in their private vehicle.
