I am writing this submission in regards to the proposed changes to the Youth Allowance. As a current year 12 student I am outraged at these changes which will leave many current and future university students without financial support. Requiring young people to work 30 hours a week for **two** years is absurd, for two reasons;

1. Universities only allow students to defer for **one** year, which is the only time we can work full time and
